Primary goal:

To deliver **outcome-based integrated care to older people, by using large-scale implementation of ICT support, to improve their quality of life and their families, while also making European health and social care systems more sustainable.**

Secondary goals:

- Improved patient outcomes and patient experiences
- **Improved job satisfaction and work pressure healthcare professionals**
- More efficient utilisation of care resources and care coordination
- ICT-applications for integration and coordination of care
- Sustainable interventions that can be scaled up

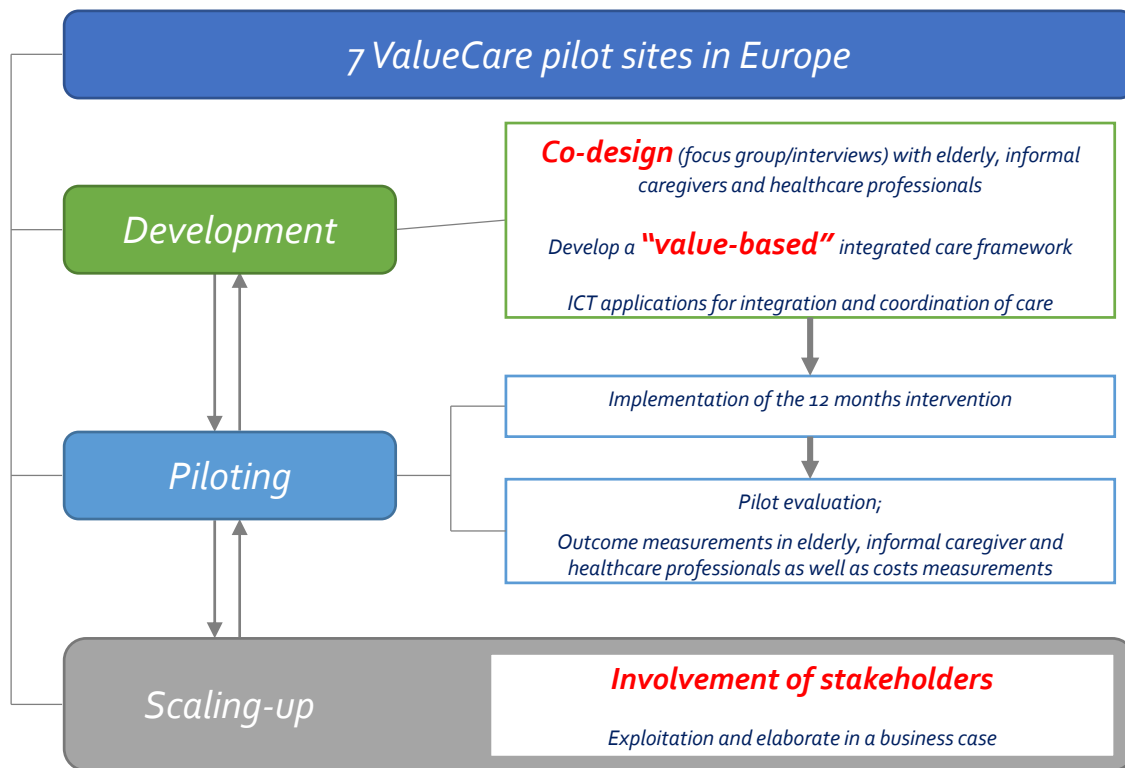

- freedom to control their own health.

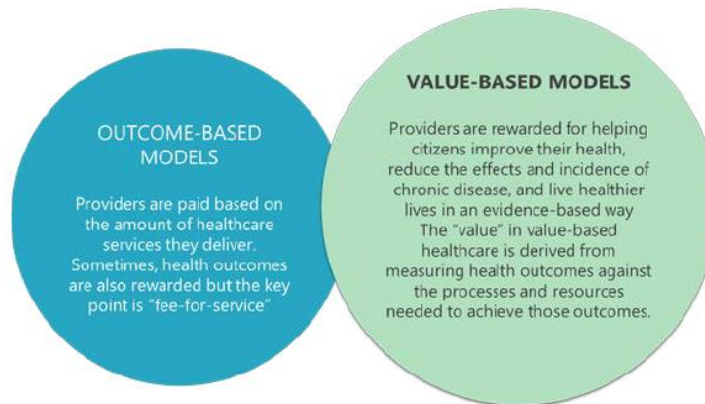


Figure 1 -Main features for outcome-based and value-based models

integrated care?

- **more broadly than health services alone.** Integrated Care solutions.
- **integration of health and social care services** is of paramount importance.
- Despite this, integrated care (health and social services) remains the **exception rather than the norm.**
- integrated care at a **larger scale** has not yet occurred in Europe.
- people in need of care are surrounded by **uncoordinated “Islands of Excellence”, when what is needed is Coordinated Care** (Rigby, 2014)
